

# ARCHERY TARGETS BY PAPER REALMS



## Assembly Instructions

Things you need:

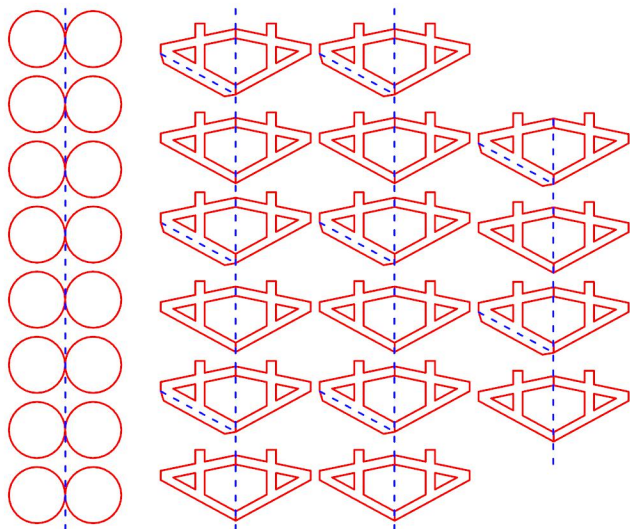
- Heavy paper (100# cardstock or matte photo paper)
- Hobby knife
- Metal ruler
- Glue

Optional:

- Black marker
- Patience







Pictured here is a cutting guide.

Score along the dotted lines before cutting out the shapes.

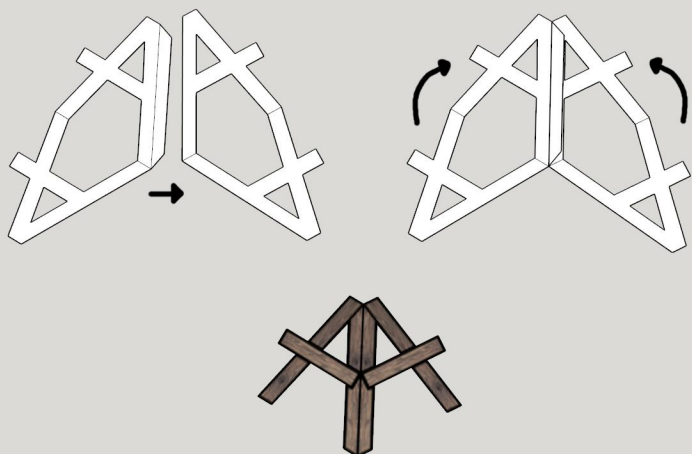
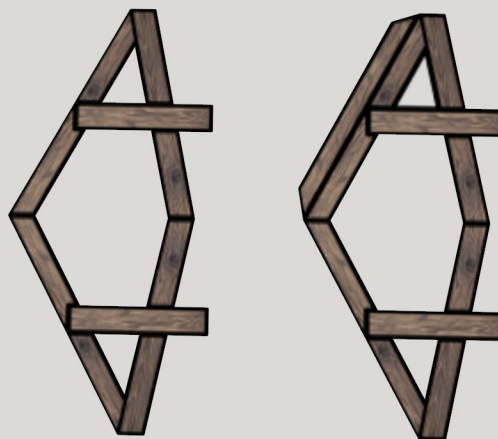
Next, cut out each row of shapes. You should have four rows of shapes, each scored along the center.

Apply glue to the backs of the round targets and fold the sides together. Let them dry before and then cut them out.

Do NOT glue the other pieces yet.

The target stands are comprised of two pieces. One side looks like a mirrored letter "A" and the other looks similar, but with an extra tab along one edge.

Trim one of each piece, so you have something like what is pictured here.



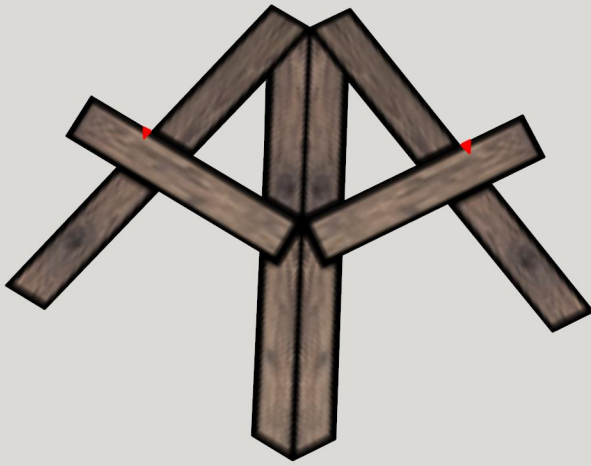
Flip the two pieces over, and glue the textured side of the tab to the untextured side of the other piece.

Then, apply glue to the untextured side of both halves of the piece and fold up to form the target stand.

The target stand should fold along the back edge. It may not be able to stand up all that well on its own, but will be able to hold its shape better when the target is in place.







Cut some tiny triangular notches where indicated in the picture here. The targets will rest in these notches.-

At this point, you can set up the stand and rest the target in place. Adjust the notches as necessary to allow the target to hold in place.

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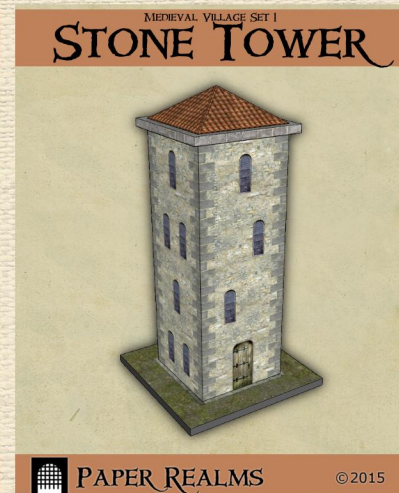
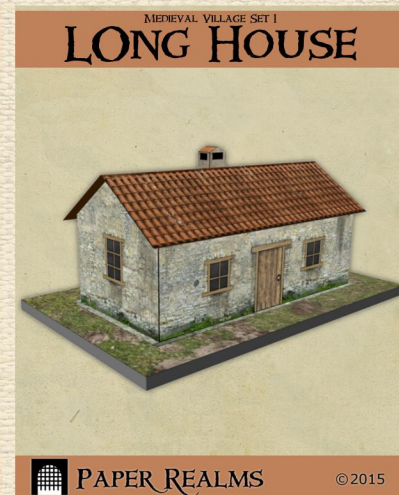
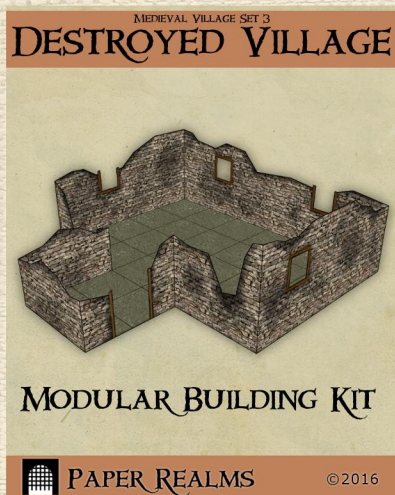
