Tigers that size have been caught, but that is a few inches longer than the longest blue shark ever caught.

Instructions

1. Carefully cut out Part 1, the Center Body. A hobby knife may be helpful. Use a dark marker to darken the edges of the paper. Score on the red line in the base and carefully fold, ensuring that both sides of the shark line up as closely as possible.
2. Cut out Part 2, the Right Side using the same care you used with the central body. Use a dark marker to carefully darken the edges of this part and color the back side of the pectoral fin.
3. Do the same thing for Part 3, the Left Side, that you did for Part 2.
4. Carefully glue Part 2 to the right side of Part 1, carefully lining up the nose and tail. Don't overglue or the ink will splotch and hold it tightly for a minute or two. It really isn't a bad idea to let the model dry 10 minutes or more before moving on.
5. Glue Part 3 to the left side of Part 1 with all of the diligence you have used so far. Let the model dry overnight.
6. Now that the model is dry, gently spread the pectoral fins outward from the body until they look right to you.

Tiger Shark

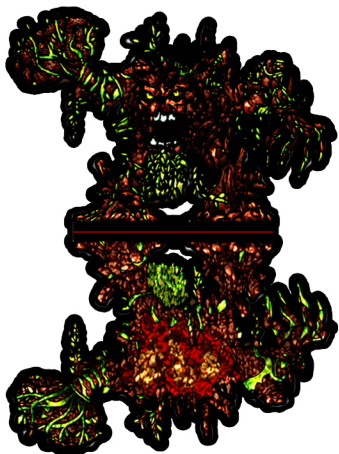
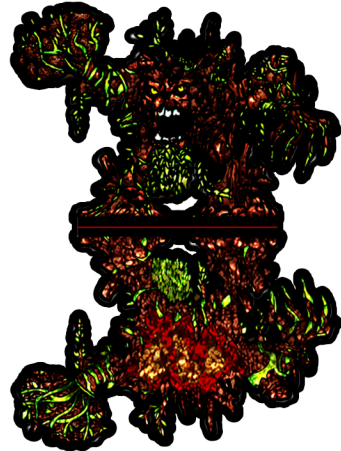
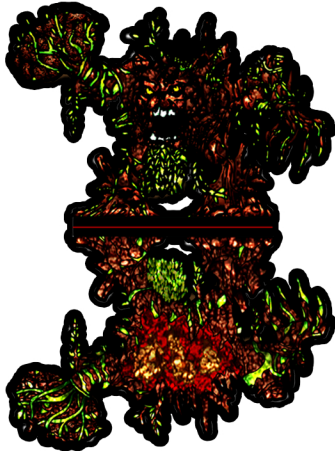
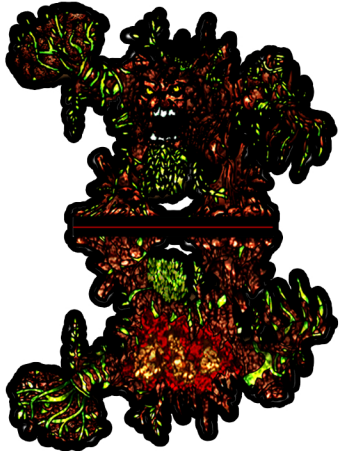
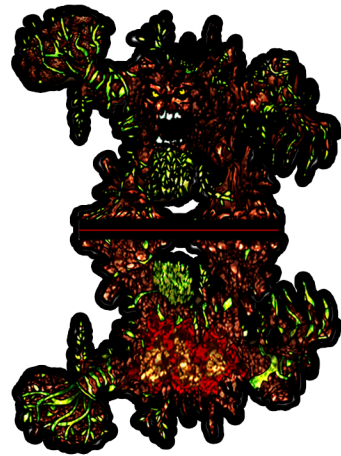
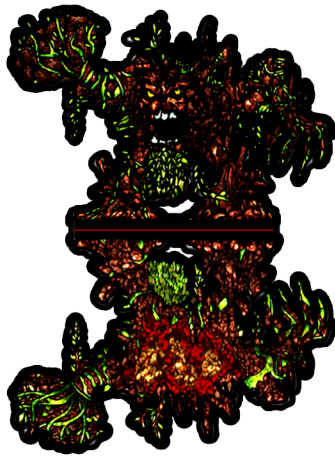
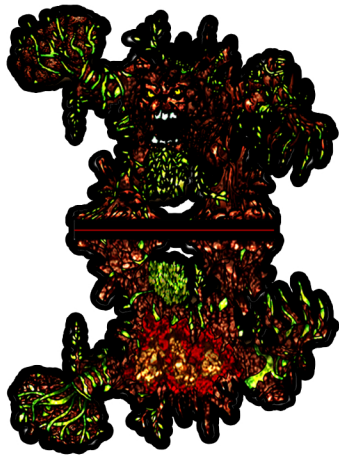
1. Carefully cut out Part 1 (a hobby knife may be helpful). Score on the red line. Fold on the line and glue, making sure body halves align as closely as possible.
2. Cut out parts 2 and 3, the sides of the shark, very carefully. On the Blue Shark, pay special attention to where there is no black border. This is where the sides will line up with the dorsal fin on the center body of your shark.
3. Glue Part 2 to the right side of Part 1, carefully aligning from head to tail and with every fin. Smooth it out and hold it tightly for a couple of minutes. Let it set for at least ten minutes before continuing.
4. Glue Part 3 to the left side of Part 1, carefully aligning from head to tail and with every fin. Smooth it out and hold it tightly for a couple of minutes. Let the miniature dry overnight before continuing.
5. Using a dark marker, darken the edges of your miniature all the way around.
6. Mount the miniature in a pill or rectangular base. Personally, I recommend one with a sand or water texture.
7. Gently spread the pectoral fins of the shark until they look right to you. I recommend holding the model by the other hand by pinching above the pectoral fins tightly while you spread them.
